## BEGINNINGS AND ESTABLISHMENTS

Mr. John Baldwin, having educated himself by working as a janitor and by chopping wood, made education his mission. He founded the Baldwin Institute in New York in 1845 and the Baldwin High School in 1882.

The Baldwin school for girls was established in 1903 and continues to provide quality education to girls in Bangalore. By the year 1990 the need was felt for good post-schooling education for women and the PUC section emerged. This was expanded with the addition of the Degree section in 1995.



## Management and Affiliation



The Baldwin Women's Methodist College is managed by the Methodist Church in India with the Bishop Rt. Rev. N. L. Karkare, Bishop of the South India Regional Conference as the Chairman of its Board.

The Pre-University Course approved by the Karnataka Government, comes directly under the purview of the Pre-University Education Board of Karnataka State. The Degree college is affiliated to the Bangalore Central University and recognized by the Government of Karnataka.



### VALUE EDUCATION

Value Education classes are held at all levels in the College in which we aim to bring about the primacy of persons over things, of spiritual values over material things and of ethics over technology. To develop an integrated personality, responsible citizenship and awareness of problems in society are the objectives of these classes.

### CAREER AND PLACEMENT

The Career and Placement cell provides a range of academic support service to enhance students with skills and job opportunities.

### FACULTY

The dedicated faculty stand as the forte of the college. Lecturers go beyond the boundaries of classroom-defined 'line of control' and plan workshops, seminars, educational and industrial tours to places of interest and learning. Besides their regular teaching hours, they spend time with the students in counseling them and giving valuable guidance.

It also helps in building cordial ties between colleges.

Presently, the college boasts of more than 60 cadets under the purview of 7 Karnataka Battalion Army wing with an Associate NCC Officer.

## HOW TO APPLY?

1. The application forms can be obtained from the Vijaya Bank BGHS Extension Counter, No. 90 Richmond Road, Bangalore-560 025.
2. The application forms duly filled in the applicant's own handwriting must be returned to the office within the due date.
3. Applications should be accompanied by attested or photo copies of the following:
  - a) Statement of marks obtained in the last examination.
  - b) Transfer certificate from the institution last attended.
  - c) Latest caste certificate in the case of students belonging to SC/ST/BC/BT.
  - d) Migration certificate in the case of CBSE ISC/Others and those coming from other states.

## EXAMINATIONS

1. There will be two tests in each semester. These Marks will add up to their internal assessments marks.
2. Internal Assessment Marks includes marks assigned for assignments, 2 tests and also attendance.
3. Students resorting to unfair means during examinations will face disciplinary action.

### Attendance

1. Attendance registers will be maintained by the lecturers and they will take attendance for each hour.
2. Students are expected to be in the classes on time. Late-comers will not be allowed to enter the class.
3. No student may absent herself from classes without leave. All leave applications must be addressed to the Principal and signed by the Parent / Guardian.
4. Leave applications for reasons of illness beyond four days must be accompanied by a medical certificate.
5. Absence of students on days of tests and examinations and on the first and last working day of each term will be seriously dealt with.
6. Students are advised not to absent themselves for trivial reasons. They are reminded that good results depend much on time spent constructively.
7. Attendance status will be displayed on the notice board every month.



## ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT FOR FINAL EXAMINATIONS

1. 75% attendance is compulsory in all subjects and in every semester (Bangalore Central University Rule).
2. Hall tickets will not be issued for semester exams if any student has attendance less than 75% in any subject.

## GENERAL RULES

1. The first hour of the morning session will commence after prayer which is compulsory.
2. The students are expected to greet the lecturer with a polite 'Good Morning' or 'Good Afternoon' as the case may be on meeting them for the first time each day.
3. Inattentiveness in class, insubordinate and rude behaviour of any kind to the lecturers will face disciplinary action. The transfer certificate of such students will be issued to them before the end of term, after due warning.
4. When there is no class, students should spend their time in the library.
5. Students must treat the building, furniture and equipment with care and consideration. Any loss or destruction will be chargeable individually or collectively.
6. Students will carry their identity cards with them at all times. This will be shown to authorized persons when demanded.
7. Students are advised to check the College Notice Board everyday.
8. Strikes and similar demonstrations are not allowed but a respectful representation of grievances will always be looked into.
9. No books, pamphlets or papers will be circulated by the students, nor tickets for any programme sold within the premises without the permission of the Principal.
10. There shall be no money raised for any purpose whatsoever, or gifts made to staff members, or others, without the permission of the Principal.
11. Students will not meet visitors in the College. They will have their letters, money orders, and communication addressed to their home or hostels.
12. Excursions, if any, of long or short duration, will be organized by the College Authorities only.
13. Students are expected to adopt a modest style of dress (Salwar kameez / Jeans with long kurtas only) within the premises. Students not conforming to this may be required at any time to leave the college.
14. Usage of mobile phones is strictly restricted in the college building.
15. Parents are expected to keep in touch with the staff from time to time during lunch break on Fridays.
